### **3.1. J.J. Mancini**

#### **4. Identify Officers - motion to Identify officers for this year**

#### **5. Property Crime**

Report from Laura Trujillo; Projects going on with the department and area command. In regards to Robinson Park - the previous year the Parks Dept gave a lot of money to officers patrolling the park. Swing-shift hours there will be a few hours where officers will patrol the parks specifically through June. If the Parks Department has additional money after that it will continue throughout the summer. Central & 6th Street -- concerns about gunshots in the area. 60-day operation plan with a mobile command center set up and cameras set up as a more long-term preventative measure.

Syringe concerns really focused around Robinson Park. Solid Waste and Family & Community Services help clean up needles in parks.

If you want to start a Neighborhood Watch, the block captain will have an officer assigned to them and have direct communication with Laura Trujillo. Question about noise complaints along central with modified exhaust. The officers have done a lot of training on that for the evenings/weekends.

#### **6. Downtown Run Around Bus "Hop-on, Hop-off"**

Presentation by Kay. Revitalize downtown and help move both locals and tourists. The whole circuit would take about 45 minutes including the stops. Spoke with the Mayor on Sunday and gave him a rundown of this idea which he really liked. In touch with Albuquerque Transit. Good feedback from neighborhood associations in the area. Looking for the City to contract this as a small business. Or could the Albuquerque Trolley Company modify and do something like this? Does it compete with them?
